The Foundation 100 lives (CiENViDAS), is a nonprofit NGO dedicated to caring for children in India, mainly infected and affected by the HIV virus, whose condition as orphans or with parents who cannot take care of them puts them in a position of defenselessness and social rejection leading to abandonment and even death.

To this end we have been developing our work, mainly in Andalusia, since the date of our constitution in April 2018.

CONSTITUTION, ORGANIZATION AND PURPOSE

1. INCORPORATION AND REGISTRATION

The constitution of a Foundation and its registration, when it adopts legal personality, is a process that requires several months and a huge amount of documentary work. From the very moment the deed of incorporation was signed in April 2018, the appropriate steps were taken until November 9, 2018, when it was finally entered in the register of foundations as "Fundación 100 Vidas", with number MA-1466, the classification "Benéfico-asistencial", and the following purposes:

Defence of human rights, social assistance and social inclusion, education, cooperation for development, promotion of voluntary work, support for equal opportunities between men and women, promotion and care of people at risk of exclusion for physical, social and cultural reasons and establishment of solidarity links between people and territories.

In terms of our purpose, we can describe the 100 Lives Foundation (Fundación CiENViDAS) as

An NGO dedicated to the care of children in India, mainly infected and affected by the HIV virus, whose status as orphans or with parents who cannot take care of them places them in a position of defenselessness and social rejection leading to abandonment and even death.

2. OUR OBJECTIVE AND BASIS FOR COOPERATION

The Cienvidas Foundation was established under the framework of the above purposes, but with a single objective: to **provide protection to girls with HIV in the Jaipur area.**

Under this premise, we proceeded to study and contrast the particular needs in the area, and established as a **first objective** the construction of an orphanage for 100 girls with HIV. We focus exclusively on girls, as they are the ones who have to face the toughest conditions to have a decent life in India.

With that in mind, we outlined our **strategy for cooperation:**

In the area of international cooperation in construction projects, whether for schools, shelters, hostels, orphanages or facilities, the usual practice is for the Spanish NGO to transfer the buildings to the local NGO or some institution in the beneficiary country.

But unfortunately, the control that is demanded and carried out by the Spanish NGO does not extend for more than one or two years. And after this period, it is quite common for there to be inadequate maintenance and even improper use of the buildings or facilities that are the object of the projects. This is a sad reality that we have contrasted with many people working in NGOs like ours.

Therefore, in Cienvidas we have considered another model of cooperation. Even more so if the buildings are designed to accommodate girls and their education. Ours is not an NGO that focuses on projects and "getting out of the way". And if we use that word we do not do it pejoratively, but because it is the word we have heard many times from other Spanish NGO's leaders, even as advice of what we should do.

For this reason, our foundation, from the beginning, clearly stated to carry out the intervention but to **remain indefinitely** as an actor of the projects. Cienvidas will be the owner of the buildings it builds, and will cede their use to the local partner NGO, which will be in charge of managing the projects. Likewise, Cienvidas will maintain its collaboration and supervision with the local partner NGO in different lines:

- Management support and methodologies.
- Monthly financial support: the Spanish Foundation, after a special agreement with the local partner NGO, will sponsor the girls and will send monthly and punctually the aid obtained for the maintenance and schooling of the girls.
- Monitoring of results: Periodically, the local partner NGO will send reports on the health and academic status of the girls. Likewise, a delegate from our foundation will travel to India at least once a year to visit and check on site the results and progress achieved.
- The Spanish foundation will continue to send volunteers to help maintain the orphanage and support the girls.

This approach will ensure that buildings and facilities are used properly in the future for the purpose for which they were designed. In addition, there will be close monitoring of the proper work of the local NGO, which we will continue to support. This is a long-term cooperation, not a one-off.

3. OUR INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION PROJECT

The object and purpose of this Foundation is our **Comprehensive Protection Program for girls affected/infected by HIV in Jaipur, India.**

This program is articulated through 3 projects:

- 1- **Orphanage home** with capacity for 100 girls (in two phases of 50 girls). Project "100 lives Jaipur".

- 2- **Food Sovereignty Project:** small-scale agricultural and livestock farming for food self-sustainability It is estimated that it will provide between 70-80% of consumer goods, through self-production and sale of surpluses in local markets.
- 3- **Project School** for 400-500 children. It will provide education for the 100 girls in the orphanage and 300 boys outside, who will pay the corresponding fees for their self-support.

The whole programme is focused on one general objective: **education**. After conducting many studies and field consultations with local NGO partners, we have identified education as a key to achieving the integration of HIV-affected/infected girls into society, so that they themselves become role models against the fear and stigma prevailing in Indian society.

4. CONSTITUTION OF THE CIENVIDAS FOUNDATION in INDIA

As a foreign organization is not allowed to purchase land or buildings in India, our cooperation bases oblige us to set up an NGO in India, which will be responsible for the implementation of the projects.

Through a long and intricate procedure, **FOUNDATION CIENVIDAS INDIA**, a Jaipur-based NGO with local staff as directors and representatives in India, is established and the president of the executive board, Mr. Atanasio Flores, is the president of the Spanish foundation. 99.9% of the shares belong to the Spanish Foundation Cienvidas.

This new NGO has a current account at SBI Bank, Narmin Nagar branch, Jaipur. For the time being, only the minimum amount for the incorporation and representation of the shares, corresponding to approx.

This new NGO in India (the seventh Spanish one with direct presence), was finally approved and registered in Jaipur last January 2019 after some months of intense and complicated bureaucratic procedures.

REPORT OF ACTIVITIES YEAR 2018

1. ACTIVITIES PRIOR TO THE REGISTRATION OF FOUNDATIONS (Nov 2018)

During the months prior to the registration, apart from the organizational work, the volunteers and the president of Cienvidas have been developing several activities:

Design and production of Dossier, brochures, merchandising and website

A corporate image has been developed with the help of the advertising agencies Maldon and Avanza. Also, brochures and initial explanatory dossiers of the "100 lives Jaipur project" were designed

Market stalls

The foundation's volunteers prepared this activity. To date, stalls selling merchandising, Indian crafts and information have been set up at the Zoco Muelle Uno and Malagueta (Paseo Marítimo) markets, specifically on Sundays 15 and 29 July 2018.

For this purpose, the foundation acquired a small 2x2m tent and various merchandising materials (caps, T-shirts, mugs, etc.), as well as imported Indian handicrafts.

It is expected that this activity will continue in Pier One and will be extended to other markets that may be of interest.

Benefit Dinner

On Friday 29 June 2018 the foundation held the first event of its kind: a charity dinner at the El Candado club for 120 attendees. To liven up the evening, typical Rajasthan dances were organized, a number of torchlight stunts were performed and a stall was set up to sell merchandising and Indian handicrafts.

During the event a video explaining the 100 lives Jaipur project was shown and talks and meetings were held with the attendees. The objective of the event is to disseminate the foundation and its project.

Sporting event

The idea was to organize a big sporting event for October 2018, consisting of a climb and/or a vertical race up the stairs to the terrace of the Equitativa building in Malaga. The sports and technical conditions of the building were studied and several meetings were held with the property, which was very interested and collaborative.

However, technical difficulties due to the age of the building and its lifts made it advisable to delay the celebration of the event until the completion of the renovation work that the property will soon undertake. The event is scheduled to take place in 2020 / 2021.

Volunteer Promotion

In August 2018 four volunteers and the president of the foundation made the foundation's first volunteer trip to the Aashray orphanage in Jaipur, India. Attached are some photos.

Two trips per year are planned for the foundation's own staff, as well as the organization of groups to volunteer on the same or other projects. To this end, the foundation has established contact with two voluntary associations in Jaipur, India.



2. AGREEMENTS AND COLLABORATION WITH LOCAL NGO'S PARTNERS

AASHRAY CARE HOME

Once the excellent humanitarian work carried out by this NGO in Jaipur, especially with children affected by HIV, the Cienvidas Foundation decided last August 2018 to sign the framework agreement of collaboration with AASHRAY CARE HOME. This agreement includes, among others, the development of the first project of our program, that is, the home orphanage for 100 girls affected by the HIV virus.

By virtue of this agreement, we have been collaborating with this NGO from Jaipur since our constitution in the following lines:

- ❖ Donation of van-ambulance for the transport of children and transfers to the hospital (5,500 euros).
- ❖ Aid for payment of school fees for 7 children in the Global School (Rs 27,000).
- ❖ Medical check-up for the 20 girls and 35 boys of Aashray. Design and implementation of methodology for periodic reviews and preparation of medical records. Developed by 2 volunteer nurses from the foundation last August 2018.
- ❖ Complete schooling in Tanu (fees, transport, uniform and books) at the Rawat school, English speaking (420 ?).

- ❖ Construction of dormitory module with toilet as an extension of the capacity of the current orphanage that will allow the collection and accommodation of ten more girls (7,500 euros). (under development today).
- ❖ Aid for the construction of a study room annexed to the orphanage, as the girls now study on their beds (under development).
- ❖ Sponsorship of girls: Specific collaboration agreement was signed for the development of this activity. In short, Cienvidas is looking for sponsors in Spain to take care of the *living* and *schooling* expenses. So far, we have 11 sponsored girls (with one or two sponsors per girl for a total of 49 ? per month to cover both needs). Cienvidas sends the amounts monthly to Aashray, which is responsible for establishing and maintaining regular communication with the sponsors.



3. ORPHANAGE HOME PROJECT "100 lives Jaipur"

During 2018, the technical design of the building destined to be a home and orphanage for 100 girls was carried out (Project 1 of the Programme). For this purpose, the Foundation has Mr. Atanasio Flores, Industrial Organization Engineer with 15 years of experience in the design and construction of buildings.

The resulting design has been checked with inspectors from the Child Protection Agency in Jaipur, India, to ensure compliance with the particular technical requirements. We have also had the collaboration of a local architect from Jaipur to review the particular technical aspects.

Meetings were held with local construction companies in Jaipur to form a real work budget that will allow us to plan the appropriate financing.

As far as financing is concerned, the Foundation plans to assume from its own funds and contributions from the founding partners the first phase of the project, corresponding to the common facilities of the building and accommodation for 50 girls.

Aahsray Care Home, by virtue of the agreement signed, has been in charge of the search and acquisition of the land. Together we proceeded to search for and evaluate different viable plots, a task that required several months and a trip by two delegates from Cienvidas.
